The Influence of Political Corruption on Trust and Social Cohesion

Political corruption in all its forms is a major and obvious breach of trust. Although being combatted in national and international instruments, such as the Council of Europe Criminal Convention against Corruption and the United Nations Convention against Corruption, it still happens and needs fine-grained regulation for all its different forms (e.g. party financing and revolving doors) as well as enforcement and a change in culture in many places.

The notion of trust comes in many dimensions. Trust in government and trust between citizens (social trust) are distinct notions but they are empirically connected. Living with (political) corruption damages trust in government and social institutions and impacts social inclusion and social cohesion, not only hindering economic development but also undermining the functioning of a state.

Anne van Aaken (Dr. iur. and MA Economics) is Alexander von Humboldt Professor for Law and Economics, Legal Theory, Public International Law and European Law at the University of Hamburg. She was Professor at the University of St. Gallen, Switzerland from 2006-2018. She was Vice-President of the European Society of International Law and of the European Association of Law and Economics, and is the Chair of the EUI Research Council. She is co-editor of the Journal of International Dispute Settlement (OUP) and a member of the editorial boards i.a. of the American Journal of International Law (CUP), European Journal of International Law (OUP), and International Theory (OUP). She has been consultant for the IBRD, OECD, UNCTAD, GIZ. She is currently working on behavioural economics/psychology of International Law and International Legal Theory.
