Upgrading Memory through Digital Humanities towards Cohesion in Romanian History

Recent developments, to use a common neutral phrasing, indicate that access to knowledge no longer represents a desideratum restrained to the circle of a rather obsolete elite. Furthermore, the audience largely exceeds the boundaries laid out by the representatives of traditional scholarship. Consequently the simple means of communicating and shaping of the rendered past must be adjusted in accordance with the actual needs of an ever growing community no longer bound, neither by education nor by biology, to what is - for many others - a not so remote past.
